

ATM vs ITM, do you know the difference?

They may look the same but they are two very different machines. ITM stands for Interactive Teller Machine while ATM stands for Automated Teller Machine. It is important to know the difference because LVCU has 3 ITMs and 3 ATMs throughout the communities we serve. Knowing the difference and the locations of each may better serve your needs.

We have 3 ATMs that you can drive up to in Sunnyside, Grandview, or Prosser. These machines allow you to make basic transactions 24 hours a day by using a debit card or a credit card. Simple transactions such as depositing, transferring, or withdrawing funds can be made quickly and easily using one of these ATMs.

Our 3 ITMs are located in Yakima, Pasco, and Prescott. These machines have all the same functionality as an ATM but in addition, contain a special additional feature. With the touch of a screen, you can call and speak face-to-face with an LVCU employee during call center business hours. With the personal guidance of an LVCU Member Service Representative, you are able to make multiple transactions at a time and you are even able to make payments towards your LVCU loans. It's amazing! So the next time you are standing and waiting in line at Yakima, Pasco, or in Prescott, stop and try the ITM, it might just save you some time.

SLOW SAVING TIPS
